There are also two markets in Benidorm; Els Tolls on Wednesday and the Mercadillo Pueblo in Rincón de Loix. The latter is also open on Sundays. If you are looking for second-hand bargains, vintage items or antiques, then check out the El Cisne Flea Market outside town.

Parque de Elche and Parque de l'Aigüera are two town-centre parks, with green areas and benches. L'Aigüera has two open-air stages, the Oscar Esplá and the Julio Iglesias, where cultural and musical performances and festivals take place all year round.

When it comes to **sport**, Benidorm has three magnificent golf courses, all of them with wonderful views. Las Rejas course, suitable for amateurs and with an academy, with 9 holes; and the two 18-hole course at Club de Golf Villaitana. We also have the Serra Gelada Nature Park, with five walking routes for different abilities that cross the six kilometres of mountainside, from one side to the other. Perfect for lovers of hiking, they afford magnificent views from amazing cliffs over the sea.

When it comes to **gastronomy**, it's plentiful, varied and good, an essential part of any holiday. With so many restaurants, you can choose from all types of food. Going out for some tapas in the old town has become almost a tradition. Make for Calle Santo Domingo, better known as "the Basque one's" street, and its surroundings, and you'll find a plethora of bars and restaurants specialising in tapas and nibbles.

Benidorm also has many other attractions, such as **health tourism**, with a large range of spas and wellness centres where you can lie back and relax, two well-equipped, modern private hospitals offering the latest technologies and multi-lingual personnel, four health services centres and a public district health service, not to mention the healing effects of the sun and the sea.

The main **festivals** are the Patron Saint's Festivals, which take place during the second week of November, however, there are more than 50 festivities on the calendar. From "Fallas" to the spectacular "Moors and Christians", as well as religious pilgrimages in honour of the Virgin and the "regional houses" festivals. There's room for everything in Benidorm.

Other attractions worth a mention are bingo halls and the Casino; the Benidorm Palace dinner show; as well as an amateur choir that meets every day in the Paseo de Colón and on the Levante beach, where the public sings popular songs.
